Purpose:

Providing a framework for the livestock industries to demonstrate their AMS commitment

Take home messages:

- AMS is about guaranteeing quality use of antimicrobials and is part of our duty of care for our world
- Primary producers are already active in this area; the AMS framework just allows coordination and documentation of activities while also finding any gaps
- Effective AMS involves recognition of its importance by producers and a partnership approach across industry with EVERYONE getting on board
- Continuous improvement for AMS process relies on:
 - Reviewing current usage practices (what's used, how much, why, when)
 - Developing AMS aims by identifying ways to Reduce, Refine and Replace current practices
 - Implementing the AMS plan
 - Measuring progress, reviewing achievements, barriers/enablers, critical review, then developing new objectives and
 - Repeat
- Five Rs (Responsibility, Reduction, Refinement, Replacement and Review) underpin any successful AMS plan
