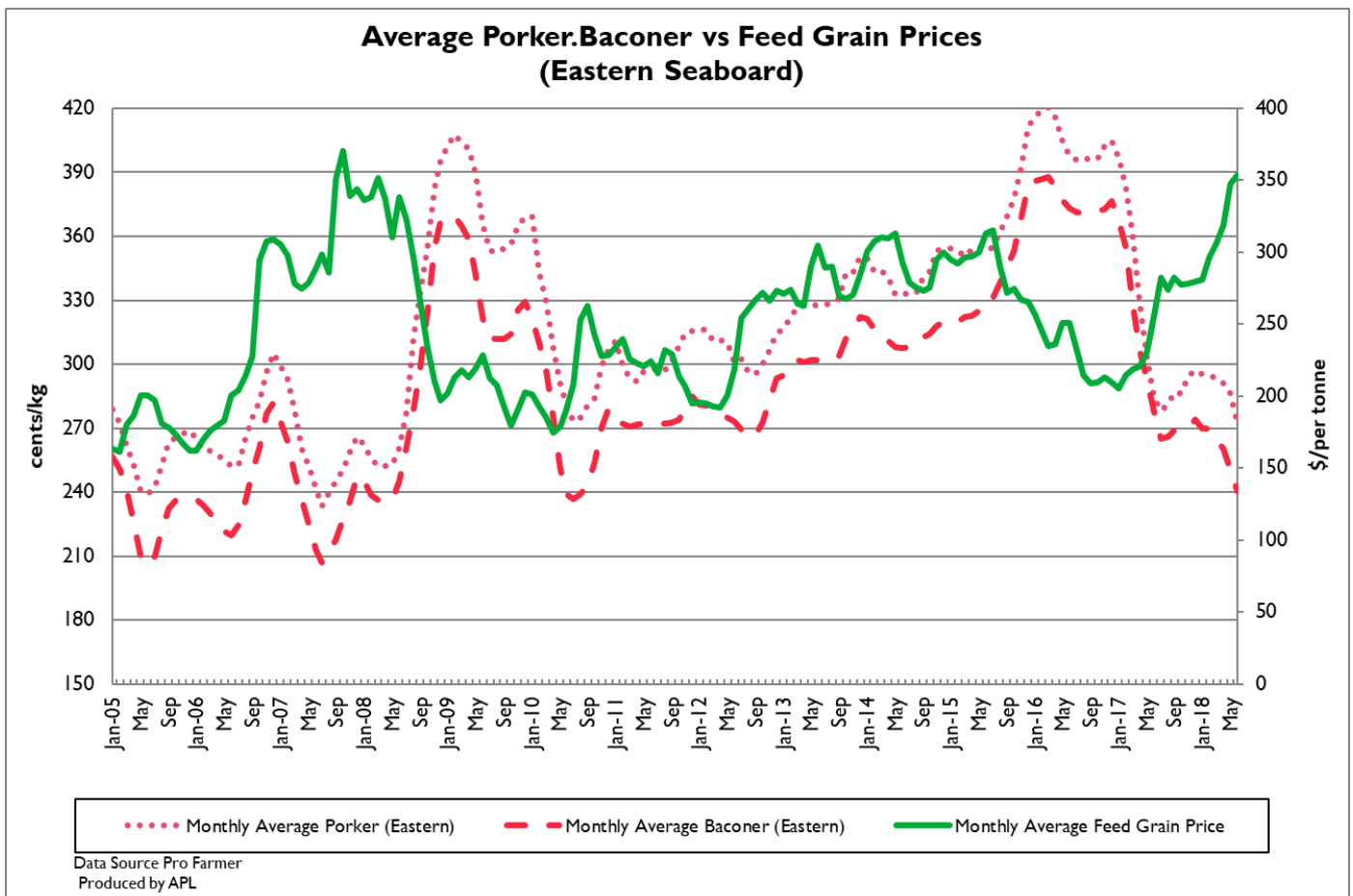

International and National

CBOT wheat markets have recently shown a level of volatility CBOT wheat futures have come under some US harvest pressure. However concerns about Russian and European production have partially offset these pressures.

The quality rating of good to excellent condition for US spring wheat, corn and soybeans remain at 5 year highs. The USDA crop progress report indicates that the US winter wheat harvest is now 51% complete. Weather woes for the Black Sea region and Russia as well as a reduction in the estimate of French wheat production and a higher than expected winter wheat crop continue to feed volatility into the CBOT wheat market.

Domestically feed grain may have hit a ceiling as prices have moved sideways to slightly lower in the past week. The concern for Aussie growers is forecasts pointing to a 50% chance of an El Nino pattern this year and have not sat well for future production.

Wheat

Sth QLD/Nth NSW

Rainfall that was forecast for the last week showed some promise and delivered in some cases but failed to provide the reprieve that most were after. Some additional dry plantings occurred in various areas, however much that was put in will struggle if there is not further rainfall in the coming weeks.

Sth NSW/VIC/SA

Feed wheat values have again come back slightly this week with markets trying to soften in Victoria. Given current level of seller engagement, new crop markets are thin in terms of liquidity.

Barley

Sth QLD/Nth NSW

Barley prices continue to move sideways to slightly lower as some pasture growth has been observed in some areas. There is a limited amount of feed barley still in seller hands.

Sth NSW/VIC/SA

Barley markets have continued to move sideways to slightly lower this week. Seller uncertainty is the main reason as to why markets are quietening.

Sorghum

Grower selling continues to be light on despite the fact that, when compared to wheat, there are some favourable sorghum prices out there..

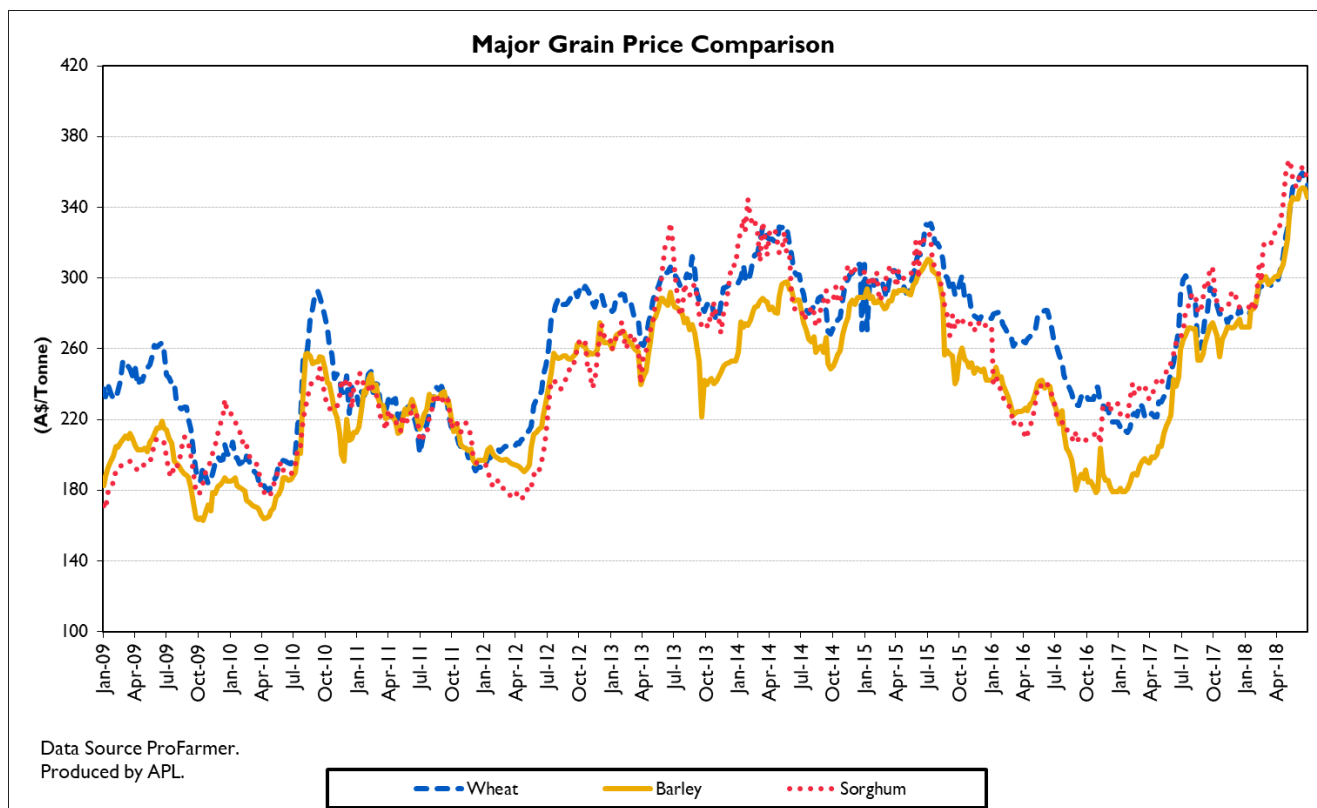
