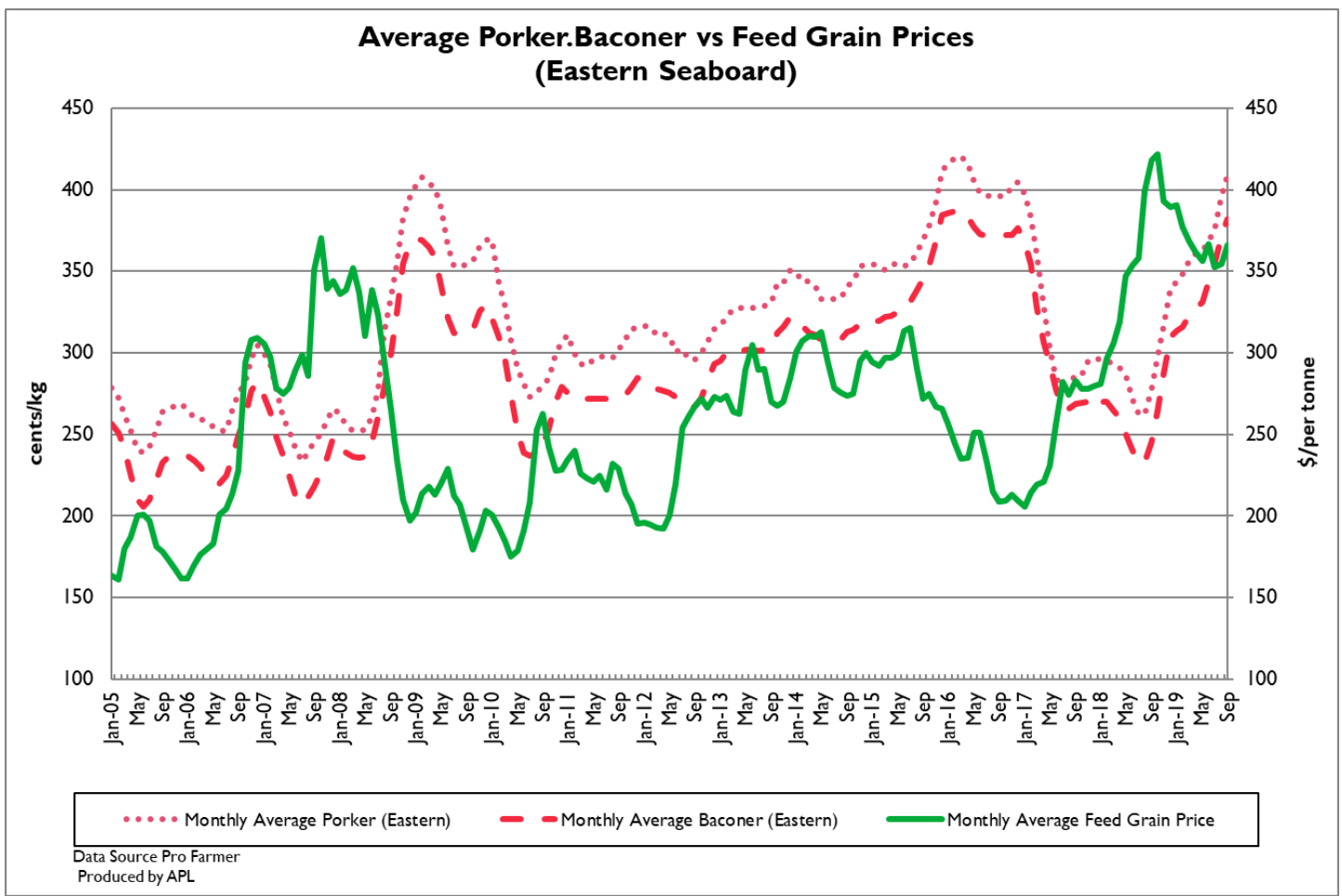

**To the point:**

- The USDA is expected to maintain estimates of a large world wheat crop in its World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates (WASDE) report.
- Locally, warm dry and windy conditions in QLD and NSW are decreasing the likelihood of many crops progressing to harvest, meaning more crops will be cut for hay or silage, while crops in WA, VIC and SA need spring rainfall.

CBOT wheat markets closed slightly higher this week. US weather forecasts continue to show dry and above normal temperatures in the 8 to 14-day forecast, with no threat of frost, which should support the ongoing US spring wheat harvest. The USDA is expected to maintain a large world crop and end stocks in its supply/demand report when it is released this Thursday night (AEST). If this is the case, we may see CBOT prices take a softer turn.

The US spring wheat crop harvest is now 71% complete which is behind the year-on-year and 5-years averages by 22% and 16%, respectively. Dry conditions forecast over the next 7 days should support harvest progress in the coming week.

Hot, dry and windy conditions across Northern NSW and QLD are degrading many crops before harvest. Crops in Sth NSW and WA are lacking moisture and are also dealing with hot weather. There is currently an elevated risk of frost throughout parts of VIC and SA.

**Wheat***QLD/Nth NSW*

Harvest has begun in Central Qld but hot, dry and windy conditions are threatening the likelihood of many crops making it to harvest, forcing some crops to be cut for hay or silage. Wheat markets have taken a firmer tone this week as demand for feed grain comes under pressure.

*Sth NSW/VIC/SA*

Wheat prices have continued to firm up over the past week. Firmer prices are a result of seasonal production risks which are still at play. Vic crops appear to be developing well but spring rainfall is needed in Sth NSW to support crop development.

**Barley***Sth QLD/Nth NSW*

Barley traded firmer this week across both markets. Warm windy conditions are deteriorating the likelihood of good production in both states. Prices remain influenced by WA and SA weather developments as production is also a concern in these states.

*Sth NSW/VIC/SA*

Old crop barley has been relatively steady to slightly firmer this week. As for new crop, the market continues to trade firmer as old crop supplies begin to shrink while demand remains steady. Demand from Nth NSW and QLD appear to be supporting prices.

**Sorghum**

Sorghum has continued to firm across both new and old crops. On-going dry conditions is keeping weather risk a premium built into new crop prices which are now trading in line with the old crop.

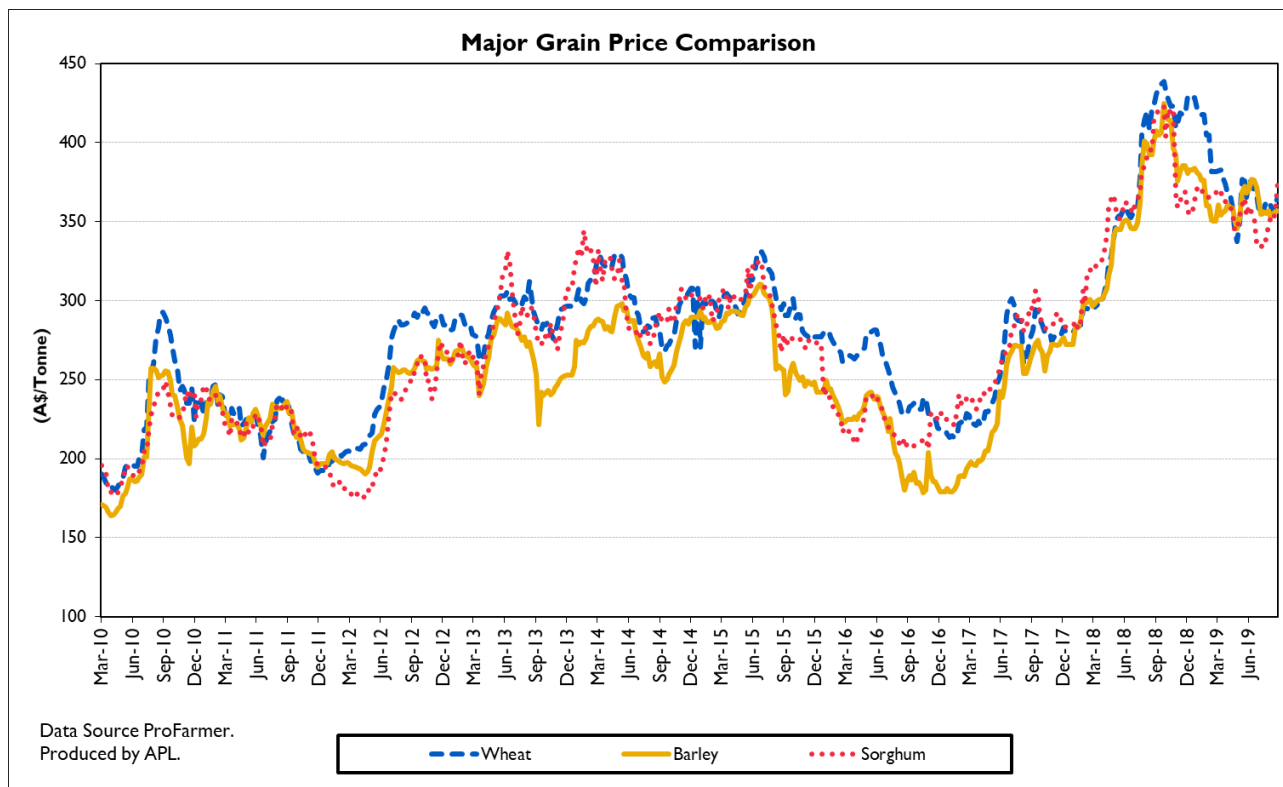
