



BIOSECURITY: KNOW THE RISKS

1

STOCK PURCHASE

Have procedures in place to ensure incoming pigs do not introduce disease.

2

GOOD PIG HEALTH PRACTICES

Monitor the health of your stock. Keep a record of treatments and losses.

3

WORK WITH YOUR VET

Develop a health plan. Seek veterinary assistance for any sick pigs.

4

VISITORS

Display biosecurity signage. Keep a visitor record. Provide visitors with clean boots and clothes. Wash and dry hands. Disinfect tools and equipment.

5

FEED

Beware of contamination. Use approved feed and ingredients only and **NEVER** feed meat products to pigs.

6

PIG TRANSPORT

Wash pig transport between loads. When moving your pigs, always complete a PigPass National Vendor Declaration (NVD).

7

FERAL ANIMALS, PESTS AND WASTE

Prevent access of domestic pigs to feral pigs and waste sites, including effluent, compost and burial pits. Control pests.

8

OTHER LIVESTOCK

House pigs separately to other livestock. Do not allow cattle and sheep to access pig feed.
